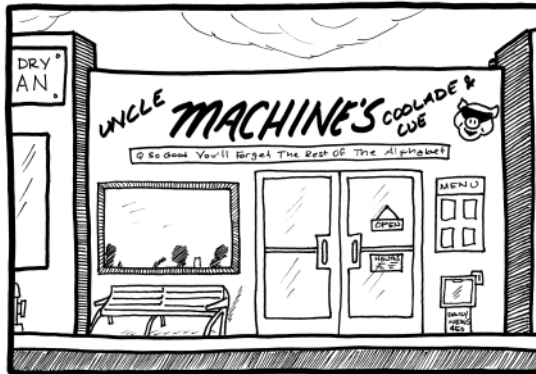
This is A.U.N.T.'s logo.

This is where I worked, the kinda-, sorta-, secret headquarters of A.U.N.T.

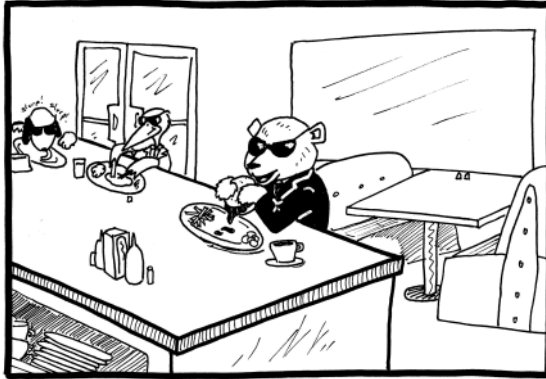


This is A.U.N.T.'s 'Front'

Well. Almost all of us.

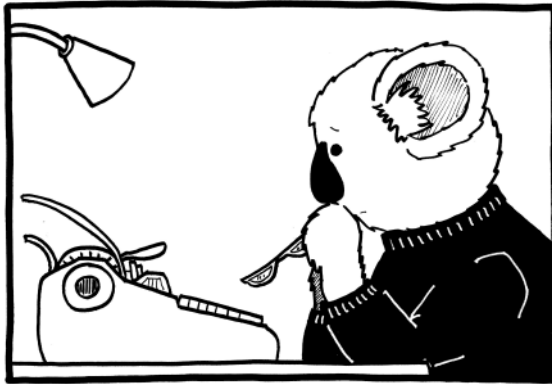

Where was I? Ah, yes.



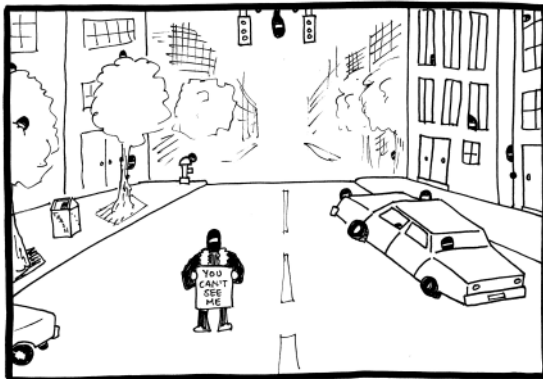
Now... where was I?

danger afoot. If you don't know we are around, and working, then you don't think about the danger we are in to keep you safe.

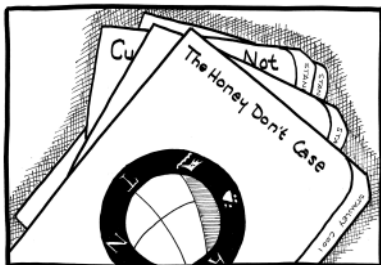
This is why chameleons were some of our best agents. And former ninjas. They were great spies.
